

How to Connect to *eLibrary*

eLibrary

1. Open browser to get on the Internet in school or at home.
2. Use this Internet address <http://www.proquestk12.com> and click on *return*.
3. Put in the following User Name and Password in the spaces under "Product Login."
4. Use this User Name: **aptakisic**.
5. Use this Password: **ajhs**.
6. Under "Go To:" click on "My Products Page."
7. On the next screen go to "eLibrary" and click on the link. You should be in eLibrary and on its search page.

Read through these instructions first before trying them. On the left of the "Basic Search" box click on "Advanced Search". Then "Clear All" media and select only "Magazines". Deselect "Include newspaper articles older than 90 days". As you scroll down you will see a place for a publication name. Enter *National Geographic*. You can enter the title of the article in "Document Title" or in the "Advanced Search" box, or use a search term such as *Darwin* or *dinosaur*, if you are not sure of the exact title, in the "Advanced Search" box to look for your article.

When you click on the green "Advanced Search" rectangle you will receive a list of articles containing your search term(s). On the left of the page is a "Sorts results by:" box. If you have a long list of results, choose "Date" to sort the articles by date and make it easier to find the particular article you want. It's easier to search by date for the article you want since some articles may not have the exact title on Dr. Brontman's list. If you look carefully at the article or articles under the correct date, you should be able to figure out the correct article even if the title does not exactly match the one on Dr. Brontman's list. See her set of articles online to exactly compare the texts of the articles you need.

If you wish to print an article, look for where the database asks for a "Print view" and click on it. This gives you a better-looking version of the article to print. Then print the article. You can also try emailing the article to yourself. You cannot receive email through the database, but often you can email the article to yourself. Notice there is a "Citation view" option that will give you the way to cite an article in APA or MLA formats.
